About Jason Malloy, Interim Music Director

Dr. Jason Malloy is an accomplished international performer and music educator. Popular with audiences for his virtuoso skills on the trombone and his on-stage humor, Jason has performed as Solo Trombonist with the Salt River Brass for twenty-two years.

Jason has performed in Europe, toured nationally with the River City Brass based in Pittsburgh, PA, and been a guest artist with the Boston Brass, Monterrey (Mexico) Symphony Orchestra, and the Phoenix Symphony. In 2005 he was selected as one of only sixteen trombonists for the prestigious Alessi Seminar, and annual intensive workshop conducted by the Principal Trombonist with the New York Philharmonic, Joseph Alessi.

Active in the Valley music scene, Jason has performed with the Arizona Opera, the Phoenix Metropolitan Opera and the Phoenix Brass Collective where he is currently a member.

Born and raised in Coeur d'Alene, ID, Jason began his music career while still in high school, performing with the North Idaho College jazz band and orchestra, as well as in community musical theater. He earned his bachelor's degree from the Lionel Hampton School of Music at the University of Idaho, and his master's and Doctor of Musical Arts degrees from Arizona State University. His mentors and influences include Alan Gemberling, Dan Bukvich, Robert Spevacek, Gail Eugene Wilson, Sam Pilafian, and Patrick Sheridan.

As Interim Music Director of the Salt River Brass, Jason is committed to showcasing the Valley's considerable local talent, bringing a wide variety of musical styles and genres to the stage, and continuing the Salt River Brass legacy as the most successful community music ensemble in the United States.

The Salt River Brass is grateful that Jason has agreed to lead the Salt River Brass until we select a new music director who is just as committed to carrying forward the vision of the Salt River Brass, which is "to become the premier brass band in America, entertain the public with the highest quality of showmanship, teach adults and children alike about music, and provide a rewarding performance experience for its members.."
